Pathways for Future Prosperity

In August 2024, the newly appointed Commissioner of Jobs and Skills Australia, Barney Glover AO, addressed the National Press Club in Canberra. In his speech Mr Glover stressed that the successful completion of a secondary school certificate and post-secondary education enhances employability. Unemployment rates for young people (aged between 25-34) without Year 12 or any tertiary qualification are above 10 percent. The unemployment rate of young people with these qualifications is just 3.5 percent.

Mr Glover also noted that 'The job market projections show that 90% of jobs in the next ten years will require post-secondary education with 44% requiring a VET (Vocational Education and Training) qualification and others requiring both VET and Higher Education'.

As we begin our 2025 academic year at Nagle College, we reflect on the importance of knowing our students and providing them with learning opportunities that address their own career goals and reflect the needs of the job market that they are moving into.

Vocational and applied learning strategies help shape our academic program by making learning more practical, relevant, and engaging. These strategies ensure that students not only develop theoretical knowledge but also gain hands-on experience that prepares them for both higher education and the workforce.

In Year 11 and 12, students have an opportunity to tailor their VCE program so they can focus on acquiring industry recognised credentials and workplace experience.

The VCE Vocational Major is a two-year vocational and applied learning program that enables students to successfully transition into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education (via a non -ATAR pathway) and training, or directly into employment.

The program enables students to undertake studies which are delivered using applied learning pedagogy, teaching skills and knowledge in the context of 'real life' experiences. Students apply what they have learnt by doing, experiencing, and relating acquired skills to the real-world. Equipping them with the skills, knowledge, values and capabilities to be active and informed citizens, lifelong learners and confident and creative individuals in a rapidly changing world.

Nagle College students enrolled in the full VM program have access to a Vocational pathway's counsellor, participate in Structure Workplace Learning, complete several short courses including a Financial Literacy course, First Aid, RSA, Safe food handling and CIC card. Students design and create products as part of there project class and sell via an online and retail start up business. This links to the VM learning areas and provides students with an understanding and experience of employability and entrepreneurial skills.

To satisfactorily gain the VCEVM certificate students must satisfactorily complete a minimum of 16 units, including:

- 3 VCE VM Literacy or VCE English units (including a Unit 3-4 sequence)
- 2 VCE VM Numeracy or VCE Mathematics units
- 2 VCE VM Work Related Skills units
- 2 VCE VM Personal Development Skills units
- 2 VET credits at Certificate II level or above (180 nominal hours).

Students must complete a minimum of three other Unit 3-4 sequences as part of their program. (Units 3 and 4 of VM studies may be undertaken together over the duration of the academic year to enable these to be integrated).

Vocational Education Training (VET)

VET allows students to do nationally recognised training as part of the VCE, VCE VM or VPC. Students can combine general and vocational studies, explore career options, and learn in the workplace.

VET develops industry specific knowledge and skills, as well as general skills needed for employment, training, and further education. VET provides students with practical skills relevant to a student's talents, and helps students work towards a formal VET qualification. Nagle College year 10, 11 and 12 students can select from a wide range of certificate qualifications some are within the timetable but there are also full day programs.
