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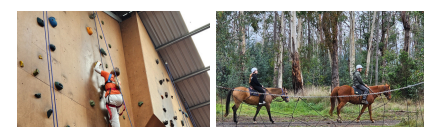

Inspired by St. John Bosco, patron saint of youth and education, we are reminded of our mission to nurture the hearts, minds, and souls of our students. His vision of forming compassionate, responsible, and faithful individuals continues to guide our schools as we prepare young people to build a better world.

Catholic Education Week 2025

Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Sale will celebrate Catholic Education Week from Friday 16 May to Friday 23 May 2025. This year's theme, Pilgrims of Hope, aligns with the Jubilee Year of Hope, calling us to journey together in faith, inspired by the Gospel message.



Catholic Education Week is a significant occasion across our Diocese, as schools and parish communities unite to honour our Catholic identity and shared mission. It is a time to celebrate the integral role Catholic schools play within their local communities and the strength of Catholic education as a whole.

Across Australia, Catholic education has grown to include 1,756 schools, educating approximately 805,000 students, around one in five young Australians and employing over 109,000 teachers and staff. This week also provides an opportunity to acknowledge the legacy of those who built the foundations of Catholic education in Australia and to look forward with hope to the continued contributions of future generations.

Recently, our community participated in the Do It For Dolly campaign, a week dedicated to raising awareness about the impact of bullying and the importance of kindness and care for one another. Activities such as this reflect our commitment to the Catholic Social Teaching principle of the Dignity of the Human Person, reminding us of our shared responsibility to promote a just and compassionate world. As followers of Christ, we look to Jesus as our model of compassion reaching out to others with empathy, dignity, and love.

Throughout Catholic Education Week, students at Nagle College will reflect on what it means to be a Pilgrim of Hope and consider the many opportunities they are offered through Catholic education. It is a time to give thanks, to recognise our blessings, and to look to the future with renewed faith and optimism.

On Wednesday 21 May, Mr Doherty and I will represent Nagle College at the Diocesan Catholic Education Week Mass at St Francis Xavier College, Beaconsfield. Our Don Bosco Youth Ministry students have prepared a special prayer that will be shared during morning Oratory throughout Catholic Education Week:
