



# HOW TO COMPLETE YOUR VTAC APPLICATION

## In six easy steps

If you're in Year 12 and you are keen to apply for university courses, this is a really exciting time! You can apply for courses to start in 2023 and for most courses, you can defer your offer until 2024. There are three ways you can apply for courses. This guide will focus on applications via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).



### EARLY ENTRY

Universities can take into consideration more than just your ATAR. Such as:

- Year 11 results
- Community service
- School recommendation
- Hardship (e.g., rural, financial).

Early entry is different at each university (dates, requirements, forms etc.).

Apart from CQUniversity, you must apply via VTAC for the course and then either direct to the university for the early entry application or via VTAC SEAS.

### VTAC

Apart from CQUniversity, you must apply for all university courses in Victoria via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).

You can apply for up to 8 courses and there are two main offer rounds in December and January.

You will place courses in order of preference, and you can only receive one offer per round.

### DIRECT ENTRY

The only university you can apply direct to in Victoria is CQUniversity. You can also apply direct to some institutes that offer university courses such as:

- Whitehouse Institute of Design
- SAE Creative Media Institute

You can apply direct to the institutes via their early admission programs.

## STEP 1

### Research courses

The first step is to research your course options and develop a draft preference list. You can use the following resources to assist you. Ensure your dream courses have back up course options.





### STEP 2 - CREATE VTAC ACCOUNT

#### Unique Student Identifier (USI)

Before you create your VTAC account, you will need to create a Unique Student Identifier (USI). If you have completed a VET subject at school or a course such as First Aid, you may already have one. You can create or retrieve your USI number via [www.usi.gov.au](http://www.usi.gov.au)

#### Steps

Applications open Monday 1 August.

1. Go to [www.vtac.edu.au](http://www.vtac.edu.au)
2. Click on 'Create an account'
3. Work through the steps. You will need your VCAA/NESA Student Candidate Number and your USI

### STEP 3 - COMPLETE COURSE APPLICATION

#### How to complete your course application

1. Login to your VTAC account with your ID and pin
2. Select the course application link
3. Work through the steps
4. Enter up to 8 course preferences.
5. Try and complete this by Thursday 29 September (5pm).

#### Changing preferences

Note: You can change your preferences as many times as you like until Wednesday 14 December (for most courses). Check your courses don't have early closing dates (e.g., medicine, portfolio/audition entry courses).

### STEP 4 - PAY THE APPLICATION FEE

If you complete your application before Thursday 29 September, the fee will be \$44. If you complete a course application after this date, there will be a late fee.

#### Steps to pay

1. Login to your VTAC Account
2. Select the payment link
3. Pay the one-off application fee.

Information from VTAC: "If there have been circumstances that have made it hard for you to do your best at study, you should consider putting in a special consideration application via VTAC's Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS). SEAS is designed to make sure institutions get a sense of your full potential and it enables institutions to consider the circumstances you have experienced and their impact upon your studies when making selection decisions.

SEAS also allows institutions to identify applicants from under-represented groups when making selection decisions for some courses. SEAS allows selection officers to grant special consideration for course entry to applicants so that you may be offered a place with a lower rank than otherwise required, but it does not exempt you from meeting the published institutional and course requirements."

There are four categories.

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Login to your VTAC Account
2. Click on the Special Consideration (SEAS) link
3. Apply for any of the 4 categories that you are eligible for by Friday 7 October (5pm).

#### EVIDENCE

Organise supporting statements and any other required documentation and post them with the SEAS document cover letter to VTAC by Friday 7 October or upload them directly to the 'Submit SEAS /Scholarships Documents' portal.



## STEP 6

### Apply for scholarships



#### Access & Equity Scholarships

There are 3 types of scholarships students can apply for via the VTAC system: access and equity, Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarships, and Academic Merit Scholarships. The following universities are not part of the VTAC scholarships program: The University of Melbourne, Australian Catholic University, and Federation University.

##### APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Login to your VTAC Account
2. Click on the scholarships link
3. Work through the steps.
4. Copy and paste information from SEAS in the financial, medical/disability and/or difficult circumstances sections (if relevant)
5. Complete application by Friday 7 October (5pm).

##### EVIDENCE

Organise supporting statements and any other required documentation and post them with the SEAS/Scholarships document cover letter to VTAC by Friday 7 October or upload them directly to the 'Submit SEAS /Scholarships Documents' portal.
